2. Purpose of the Contest

To evaluate each competitor's knowledge and practical abilities in installing a complete plumbing system, with emphasis on high-quality work, proficient pipe-joining techniques, precise measurement and layout, and effective time management throughout the project.

3. Criteria

Participants will be evaluated on their ability to always work safely and responsibly. The competition provides an opportunity for competitors to demonstrate the quality of their work, commitment to personal and professional growth. Competitors are also expected to show professionalism by respecting the judging process and accepting final decisions with maturity and sportsmanship.

4. Number of Stations / Competitors

There will be up to 10 stations/ competitors



5. Knowledge, Skills and Abilities to be Assessed

- Interpreting and applying the blueprint specifications, product specifications and shop drawing
- Complete a material list for assessment.
- Calculate lengths, measurements and fitting allowance and various piping offsets (metric)
- Apply safe work practices.
- Assemble piping project as represented in the drawing.
- Use various pipe and joining methods including but not limited to the following types of pipes and fitting systems – ABS, PVC system 15, Cast-iron, pex (various fitting systems), Viega Propress and copper to name some;
- Set a plumbing fixture
- Perform an air test.

6. Prerequisites

Post-Secondary competitors must meet the following criteria in the current school year:

- Be enrolled in a community college, university, private school OR be a registered apprentice with the Department of Labour and Advanced Education (Apprenticeship Agency);
- Be registered as a competitor with Skills Canada Nova Scotia;
- The competitor cannot be a certified journey-person;
- Possess Canadian citizenship or Permanent Resident (Landed Immigrant) status and be a resident of Nova Scotia; or be a registered International Student. Competitors are responsible for verifying this information if requested;
- Have been earning post-secondary credits in a sector relevant to the one in which they
 wish to compete (i.e. to compete in carpentry, the student would be earning credits in
 any construction-related trade) at any time during the academic school year (September
 to June);
- All competitors must be able to show either current apprenticeship status and/or proof
 of enrollment in a post-secondary institution upon request of the Provincial Technical
 Committee (PTC) or Skills Canada Nova Scotia.
- Have completed and submitted a signed release form
